

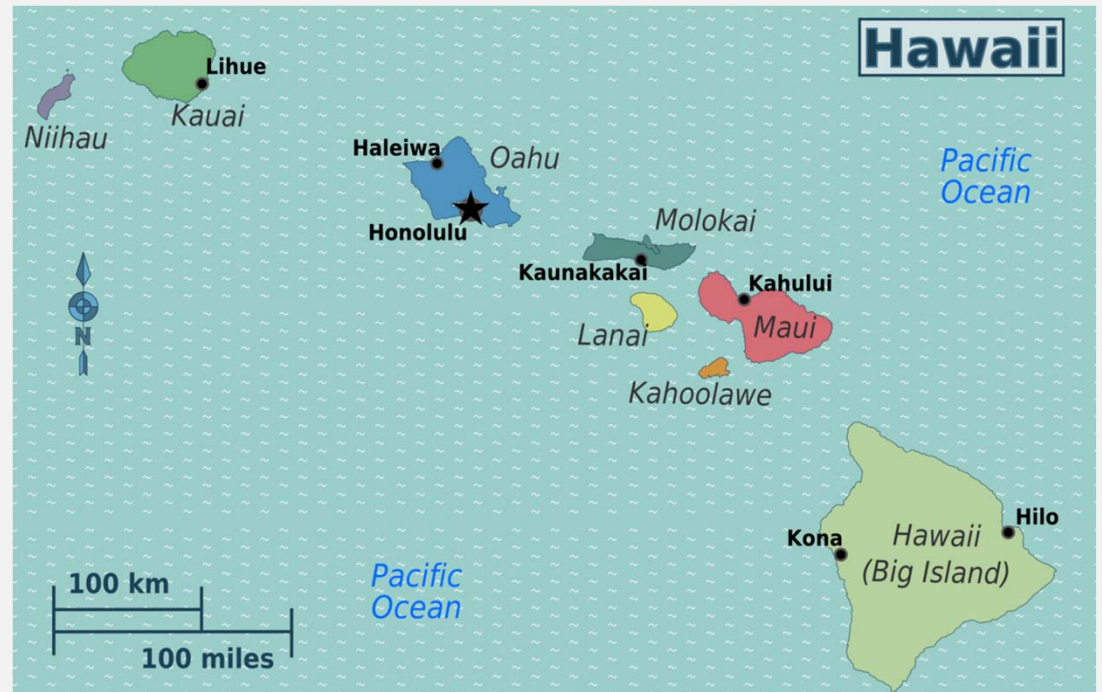

MAP OF HAWAIIAN ISLANDS

- Hawaii has a unified system
 - Integrated State level Prison-Jail System
- Correctional Centers (Jails) on
 - Hawaii, Maui, Oahu, and Kauai
 - Oahu has largest population
- Correctional Facilities (prisons) on
 - Oahu, one Prison facility on Hawaii
- Transportation of inmates an issue
 - 14 day quarantine when traveling to Hawaii or between Islands
 - Requires additional, separate, housing



EFFECTS OF COVID

In March, the Public Defenders Office filed a Petition for Extraordinary Writ requesting that the Department of Public Safety significantly reduce the populations of the Correctional Centers and Facilities.

From March 19th to the 26th Hawaii saw 90 new COVID cases in State

During this time news outlets reported about COVID in prisons

Hawaii Jail system has/had issues with overcrowding



Special Master appointed to review cases/arguments between Defenders and Prosecutors on whether specific inmates should be released early.



RELEASE CRITERIA

- SF and PARV with less than 18 months remaining on sentence excluding those who committed the following types of offenses
 - Violent crimes
 - Burglary in the 1st or 2nd degree
 - Abuse of a family member
- SM
 - Abuse of a family member
 - Violation of a TRO or Order of protection
- Pretrial Population
 - Same as above

OCCUPANCY RATES

- COVID testing only done on symptomatic patients
- December 2019
 - Overcrowding at all Jails
- June 2020
 - Overcrowding eliminated in all but 1 jail
 - Big Island releases related to the requirement of having an address

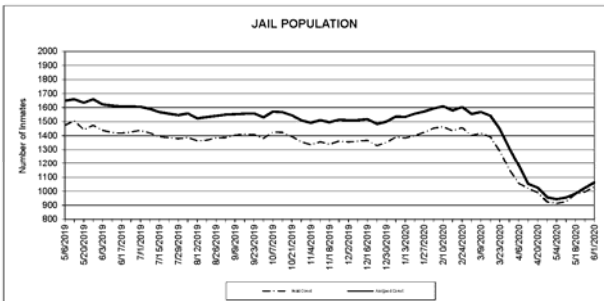
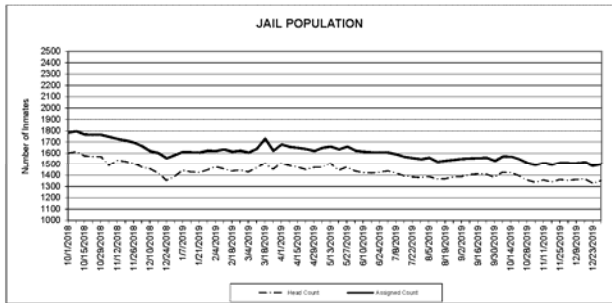

POPULATION TRENDS

The dotted line in both figures indicate the Head Count

The top figure shows the jail population for the 10/2018 thru 12/2019

The figure shows that the jail population was stable during that time

The bottom figure shows jail population shows jail population from 5/2019 to 6/2020

The figure shows a significant reduction in jail population with the Special Master

The more recent uptick seems to be the result of 2 trends on the Big Island

- New arrests

- Contempt of Court – Judges revoking early release

SUMMARY

- We have successfully reduced the overcrowding in our Jails
- We have never had a case of COVID in our Jails or Prisons
- Rearrests of released individuals
 - Roughly 50 of the 650 released inmates have been rearrested on new charges
 - That is approximately an 8% rate
- Length of Stay has increased for our Pretrial population, as the less risky people have been released
 - December 2019 LoS
 - PTM 12 days,
 - PTF 20.5 days.
 - May 2020 LoS
 - PTM 16 days
 - PTF 43 days.
