Reasons why BJS should do a collection

- Much of the information available on this topic is not comparable
 - A BJS collection would allow for all states and the Bureau of Prisons (BOP) to report tests, positive tests, and deaths that met the same criteria.
- BJS's statistics are independent
 - They would be seen as more trustworthy than advocacy organizations who might use the data to promote an agenda.
- If we can collect mitigation policy information in addition to counts of cases, the collection could inform correctional authorities



Proposed timeline

- Early July CU cognitively tests the questionnaire.
- July 31, 2020 CU submits 30-day notice to Federal Register, full emergency clearance package to OMB.
- September 1, 2020 Begin fielding survey.
- October 1, 2020 Begin nonresponse follow-up.
- October 31, 2020 Complete data collection.



Proposed topics for questions

- Monthly counts of total prisoner population, admissions and releases
- Cumulative (February August) counts of:
 - Total number of viral tests given to staff and prisoners
 - Number of unique positive viral tests for staff and prisoners
 - Number of confirmed and suspected deaths of staff and prisoners
 - Number of prisoners who received expedited release in response to the COVID-19 pandemic (by sex and race)
 - Number of prisoners hospitalized for at least one night on-site and sent offsite
 - Some of these questions will request a disaggregation by race or age
- COVID-19 spread mitigation techniques check-off table (next slide)
