

<u> Justice Reinvestment Initiative (JRI) – State Outcomes</u>

Through JRI, state leaders work with experts to conduct agency-spanning data analysis; develop and implement data-driven, tailored solutions to address complicated criminal justice challenges; and maximize resources to achieve stronger and safer communities.



SOUTH CAROLINA

JRI Year: 2010 Goal: Improve community supervision, reduce the prison population and cost of incarceration



TEXAS

JRI Year: 2007 Goal: Reduce corrections spending and increase public safety



MISSISSIPPI

JRI Year: 2014
Goal: Manage costs
associated with state
prison and local jail
populations and reinvest in
effective programs

Outcomes:

- 22.5% decline in the overall prison population from 2009 to 2018
- 58% decline in revocations from 2010 to 2018
- Closed 6 prisons
- Nearly \$500 million saved between 2012 and 2017
- No increase in crime

Outcomes:

- 30,000 person decline in prison population since 2007
- Averted more than \$1.6
 billion in additional
 prison construction and
 operating costs
- Closed 16 prisons
- Reduced recidivism
- Crime rates are near historic lows

Outcomes:

- 22% decline in the overall prison population from 2014 to 2022
- 28% increase in the portion of prison beds occupied by people convicted of violent offenses from 2014 to 2022

OKLAHOMA

GEORGIA

JRI Years: 2012, 2017 Goal: Safely minimize the use of incarceration and increase the use of alternatives that reduce recidivism



UTAH

JRI Year: 2015 Goal: Reduce recidivism, hold people accountable, and control the state's prison population growth

Outcomes:

- Awarded local law enforcement \$10 million+ to implement data-driven strategies
- Curbed projected population growth with over 6,600 fewer people in prisons in 2019 than anticipated pre-reform
- Led to a \$12 million investment in corrections and treatment programs

Outcomes:

- **5.65% decline** in the overall prison population from 2017 to 2020
- 11.31% decline in the actively supervised probation population from 2016 to 2020

Outcomes:

- 21% decrease in the prison population
- 44% increase in the portion of prison beds occupied by people convicted of violent offenses from 2014 to 2021
