

Invitation to Apply for the Improving Community Supervision National Training & Technical Assistance Program

The Crime and Justice Institute (CJI), a division of Community Resources for Justice, with funding from the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP), is pleased to provide targeted short-term comprehensive training and technical assistance (TTA) in the following areas: **(1)** Training, **(2)** System/Program Assessment, **(3)** Policy Implementation and Sustainability, and **(4)** Stakeholder Collaboration and Information Sharing. This support will be provided to competitively selected community supervision agencies and community-based providers to meet the goals of the Second Chance Act. The overarching goals for the “Improving Community Supervision” program are to strengthen community supervision practices, produce better outcomes for youth and communities, reduce recidivism, and improve public safety.

Eligibility

Applications will be accepted from:

- Local, regional, or Tribal:
 - Community supervision agencies
 - Community-based providers
- Agencies who serve moderate-to-high-risk and needs youth on community supervision

Note: Agencies & providers seeking statewide engagement or that do not serve the youth population are ineligible to apply for TTA.
